





- School Report
- Required Essay

- Transcript





Rutgers and Middlesex College are the two most attended Colleges for NBTHS students.

20% of 2024 graduates went to <u>Rutgers</u> 23% of 2024 graduates went to <u>Middlesex</u>



# When applying to Rutgers



When applying to Rutgers University, students will be asked to rank their:

- 1. Top 3 majors in descending order
- 2. Preferred campus in descending order

Students will also be asked to submit something called the Self Reported Academic Record (SRAR)

If a student is accepted, he/she will be admitted into 1 of the 3 majors and 1 of the 3 campus' based on the strength of his/her application

Ex: Finance at RU Newark

If a student is not accepted, transfer into RU from Middlesex or other colleges is sometimes easier than being accepted Senior year of high school.

# About Middlesex MIDDLESEX

Middlesex College is a great place to start and if needed, a student can have a fresh start!

- Once 30 credits are earned (1 year) a student's college transcript is used for transfer purposes.
   At that point, the high school record is usually not used for transfer to a 4 year college.
- Note: The nursing program at Middlesex is competitive and has additional requirements and deadlines than all other majors
